BELONGING TO ST JOHN'S

One of the best things about the good news of Jesus is that he calls us into <u>a new community</u> – young and old, male and female, locals and internationals, scientific and artistic, politically left and right, home-owners and council tenants, but all united in our love for Christ (Galatians 3.28).

This unity in Christ should be expressed in our **common life together** – worshipping, supporting, sharing, serving, praying, forgiving. All this arises out of our sense of belonging to one another as members of God's family. God has called us together to demonstrate the values of His Kingdom in our community life.

There are lots of ways of <u>showing that we belong to St John's</u>, such as joining in Sunday services, being part of a small group, having an area of service within the life of the church, giving regularly, and being on the church electoral roll. If you are not already on the electoral roll, let me encourage you to join today. You can do so by filling in the form opposite. Read on for further details.

WHY JOIN THE ELECTORAL ROLL?

Joining the electoral roll is an important way of **confirming your commitment to St John's community** and to the vision of the church. It also opens up the way for greater involvement in the life of the Church of England, at Deanery, Diocesan and national levels. By joining, you become entitled to participate in the government of the church and to vote at St John's Annual Church Meeting.

Joining the roll is an **important statement of witness** and a step along the path of discipleship. With your name on the electoral roll, the strength of the Church can be seen in our local area and across London and Kent. If you're a regular at St John's, you should be on the electoral roll!

Notes on filling in the Electoral Roll Form

- 1. The only Churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign churches.
- Membership of the electoral roll is also open to members in good standing of a
 Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the
 doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare
 themselves to be members of the Church of England.
- 3. Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can re-apply. If you are not resident in the parish but were on the roll as a habitual worshipper and have been prevented by sickness or absence or other essential reasons from worshipping for the past six months, you may write "would" before "have habitually attended" on the form and add "but was prevented from doing so because" and then state the reason.
- 4. If you have any problems over this form, please speak with the Vicar or Celia Tucker, who will be pleased to help you.
- 5. In this form 'parish' means ecclesiastical parish.

St John's and Data Protection

By joining the electoral roll, you <u>agree</u> for your details to be stored in electronic and paper form for the purpose of maintaining the electoral roll. Please note that Church of England Regulations require us to display the complete electoral roll (names and addresses only) on a notice board within the church for certain periods of the year.
