
#### 3. Election of Church wardens

## 2. Minutes of the Annual Parochial Meeting held on Sunday, 30th April 2023

These Minutes were available immediately following the meeting last year and have been available on the church website and by post if requested in the weeks prior to this meeting. There being no amendments required to the Minutes these were proposed for acceptance by Liz Bostock and seconded by Alistair Mackenzie and agreed to by the meeting. Signed by Rev McClellan as a true record.

## 3. Electoral Roll Report

Mrs Tucker reported that since the last update of the Electoral Roll in April last year one member has moved away and we have had 18 new members join us. So our total on the Electoral Roll this year is 131. The next full revision of the electoral roll will take place next year. Mrs Tucker emphasised the importance of participating in the church community and outlined some of the opportunities available

The Vicar expressed thanks to Mrs Tucker for her hard work in keeping these records.

## 4. Presentation of the Annual Accounts

Copies of the accounts had been available prior to the meeting via the church website, with hard copies available on request prior to this meeting. These are attached to and form part of these Minutes.

LP presented her report on the 2023 Annual report and Accounts. She thanked her cotreasurer Laura Mason and Simon Kirk who had again undertaken the examination of the accounts at no cost to St John's.

LP commented that 2023 income reflected the continued generous support of church members, increased hall lettings and increased interest on reserve funds.

LP used 2 slides to highlight the overall income and expenditure figures in the report and the financial position at the end of 2023. There was a healthy surplus on unrestricted income and expenditure although there were no significant costs on projects in 2023. Also, we had not withdrawn from our Repair Fund. There was a significant increase in restricted income due to a £60,000 grant received from the Trinity URC Bromley Trust.

St John's held total funds £212,371 at the end of 2023. LP explained the split of these funds between three different headings, what each part can be used for and where the funds were invested.

LP acknowledged the continued support of the Girdlers Company and thanked them for their donations totalling £3,450 in 2023.

There followed an opportunity for questions from the floor. There were no questions.

AMcC expressed thanks to Lesley Pyle and Laura Mason for all their work in maintaining the accounts for us.

#### 5. Appointment of an Independent Examiner

Simon Kirk has expressed his willingness to undertake this role again for the coming year. He was proposed by Andrew Dixon seconded by Anthony Westall. All were in favour. Rev McClellan thanked Mr Kirk for his service and for continuing in this role.

#### 6. Appointment of a Safeguarding Officer for Children and Vulnerable Adults

Safeguarding is a very important issue in our church life and AMcC expressed his thanks to everyone who undertakes this important work at St John's. Emma Kerr has agreed to continue in this role and was proposed by Alison Dixon and seconded by Peter Morgan. All agreed. Simon Kirk will continue in his supporting role as Deputy Safeguarding Officer.

#### 7. Elections of Parochial Church Councillors

AMcC advised that the St John's PCC consists of himself, the two church wardens, two representatives elected to Deanery Synod (currently Tomi Odukomaiya and Tom Goodenough, elected in 2023 for a three-year term) and 12 other elected members.

AMcC advised that four PCC members (Keith Buckley, Duncan Cameron, Alison Dixon, Emma Kerr) are coming to the end of their term and all have expressed a willingness to stand again. Five other PCC members (Janet Alldread, Fiona Bentley, Heather Lloyd, Linda Nash and Lesley Pyle) have decided to step down during the course of this year. This leaves nine vacancies on the PCC to be filled at this APCM.

## 8. Report on the Fabric of the Church

Ray Sims expressed his huge thanks to the Fabric Committee who regularly undertake fabric work in the church. He also thanked Doris for her garden management and Tony for his lawn care.

Ray outlined the main Fabric work undertaken this year.

## **Projects Begun or Completed**

- Shelving units for container store
- Carbon Monoxide Alarms fitted in Church Rooms
- Car Park line marking renewed
- Purchase of various items of equipment for our Sound and Vision Upgrade. This is ongoing thanks to the expertise of Paul.
- Purchase of two lockable garden wheelie bin storage units which required total of 18 hours to construct! Doris has asked me to thank Duncan and Patrick whom I helped to assemble them.

## **Regular Essential Maintenance**

- Inspection and replacement if required of all fire extinguishers
- Replacement of light bulbs in Church. (quite hazardous !)
- Inspection of lightning protection
- Inspection of all portable electrical items from kettles to heaters.
- Inspection of both main and kitchen boilers.

In addition to all of the above many hours were spent discussing and planning new improvements plus meetings with various companies quoting for potential projects. At any moment in time we have three or more projects in development.

We welcome ideas for any improvements that could be made.

There were no questions. Attendees expressed their thanks to Ray Sims for his continued hard work by a round of applause.

#### 9. Vicar's Report

The Vicar's report is contained in full in the Annual Accounts and AMcC did not intend to read it out to the meeting but he did encourage everyone to read it for themselves.

AMcC highlighted the growth of the electoral roll this year with 18 new members. He also highlighted the increasing numbers of people attending the weekly services and highlighted that fact that our average weekly attendance for 2024 across all of our services is 132, and '100 Sundays' are now the norm.

AMcC expressed his particular thanks to:

- Celia Tucker stepping down after many years service as Electoral Roll Officer. AMcC highlighted that the role is currently vacant.
- Ray Sims for his continued service as Chair of the Fabric Committee and those other church members who help in the maintenance of the church buildings and gardens and those who participate in church cleaning.
- Caroline Thomas for continued service managing church hall bookings. AMcC highlighted the role of the church hall in the local community.
- Lesley Pyle for her continued service as Treasurer as she enters her final year in the role.
- All of those who have retired from the PCC this year for their service of the PCC and their continued service in the church community. AMcC expressed particular thanks to Fiona Bentley for her service to the church over a long period of time.
- Amanda Kirk and the flower team.
- Glynis Murton and the sacristan team.
- Everyone who supports youth and children's activity at St John's. AMcC asked for prayers as we continue to recruit a new Families Officer.
- Alfie Beston and the St John's Band for the fantastic music each week. AMcC expressed particular thanks to Alfie for growing the band.
- The Ministry Review Working Party Beryl Hitch, Glynis Murton, Matthew Leonard and Moira Morgan.
- Kim Hitch for his continued support of ministry at St John's.

Attendees expressed their thanks to all of these people via a round of applause.
